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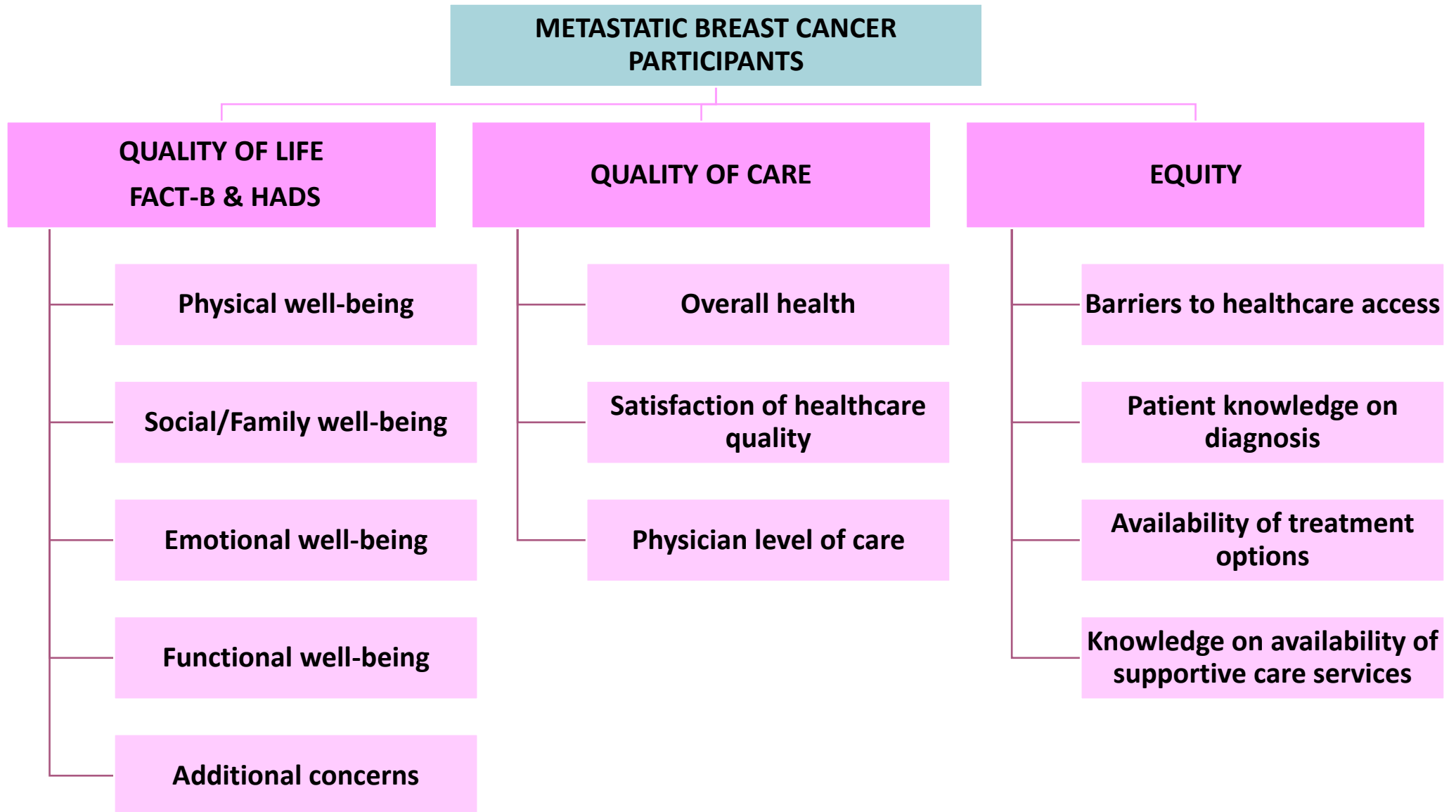
Primary Research Goals

Disparities among health systems with respect to the care and outcomes of MBC patients

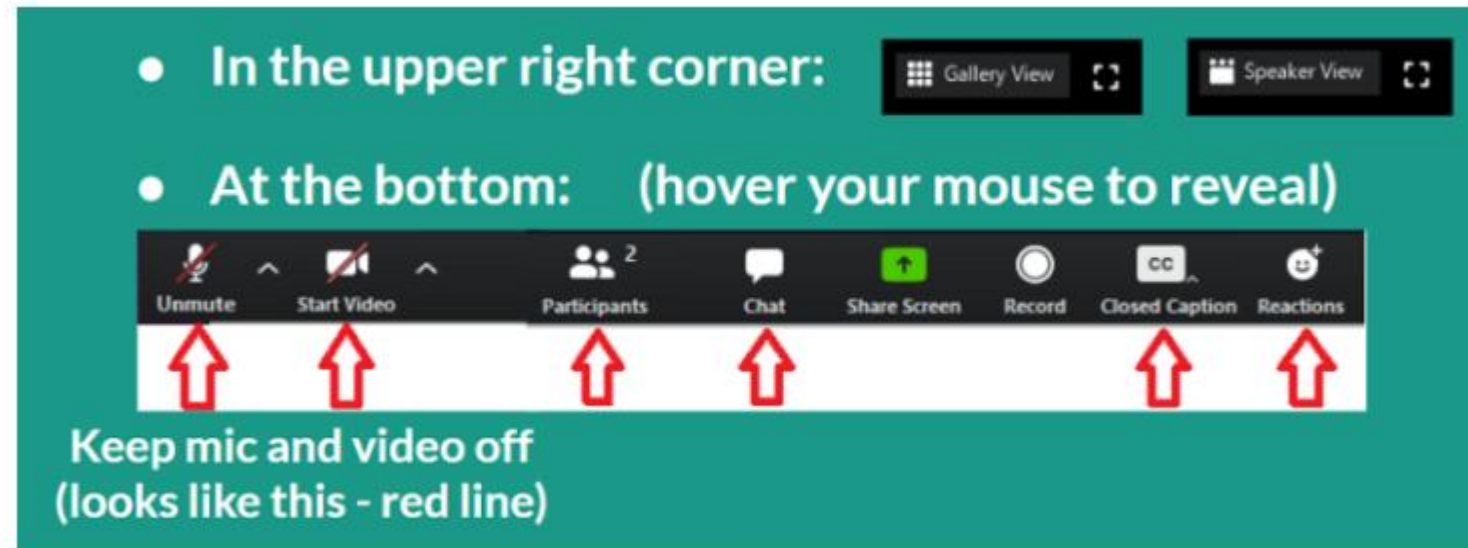
